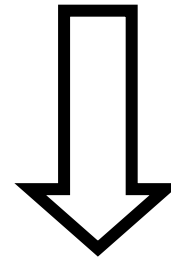
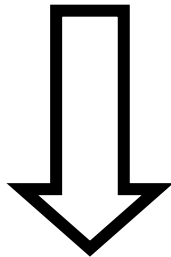
June

GARBAGE UPDATES:

- City Hall now has garbage roll out carts. They are dumped weekly and cost \$25.00 per month. These are a good option for people who have more than one bag of garbage per week and you are able to use your own garbage bags. Call City Hall to get signed up!
- Effective July 1, 2022 billing, the rate for garbage/recycling/utility rate increase by 1.5% (\$.18). The monthly dumpster fee will stay \$40.00, and additional dumps will increase to \$25.00. Bags will remain 50 cents, and tags \$1.50.

RECYCLING UPDATES:

- Thank you to everyone who has been using the recycling center! Things are getting better!
- As a reminder, please throw ALL recyclable items **BEHIND THE HALF WALL BARRIER.**
- Plastic bags, Styrofoam, hoses, twine, tubes, GARBAGE, yard waste, or electronics are NOT to be taken to the recycling center. See City Hall for more information.
- REMOVE all items from plastic bags, or use a paper bag or cardboard boxes to bring items.

In accordance with the Iowa Utility Board (IUB) NO 24-hour notices of disconnection for delinquent utility bills during the summer months (April through October) will be posted. You will still receive a 12 day notice, so be sure to check the shut off date. Avoid reconnection fees. Contact City Hall with concerns. Payment plans, All-paid (online payment), and ACH payments are available as well as cash and check.

City Hall Accepts utility payments by cash, check, ACH, credit or debit card. Cash, check or ACH is the most cost effective for you. If interested in automatically withdrawing your utility bill payment from your checking account, please stop by City Hall for more information.

Our latest option is payment by credit or debit card at www.allpaid.com. Our pay Location Code is "a002qd" = City of Livermore. ALLPAID will charge you a 2.95% fee on top of your city payment amount. This transaction fee goes to Allpaid, NOT the City of Livermore.

Sign up for a free tree in April by stopping or calling City Hall by April 22, 2022. One entry per address. Always remember to not plant your trees in the right of way or under power lines. Call 811 before digging.

City Ordinance Reminders & Changes:

****Please take pride in your property and our community of Livermore. Property should be free of trash, tires, appliances, furniture and debris ****

Mowing season is upon us, keep in mind the city ordinance states grass should be no longer than 8 inches. If the city has to mow your lawn, it is a **\$100 MINIMUM FEE**.

Pet License required. There is a 4 pet limit per residence. **Pets without tags will be considered "at large" & are subject to removal.** Please let City Hall know if you no longer have your pet that was registered.

Brush Policy-The City will no longer be doing curbside pickup. There is a brush pile at the City's shed (703 4th Ave.). Residents may bring limbs that are shorter than 10 feet long and 6 inches in diameter. Lumber, landscaping debris, and trash are NOT allowed. This area is under video surveillance. If abused, it will be shut down. Tree Companies are NOT allowed to dump at the brush pile. If residents need assistance taking brush to the pile, call City Hall for more information. Stump grinding debris is not allowed. Storm damage brush is an exemption. The City would assist with clean up on dates set by the city Council and Mayor.
