## WINTER IS COMING

**Snow Ordinance 3-4-32 & 33:** No person shall park, abandon or leave unattended vehicle on and public street, alley or City right-of-way (generally from the center of street to where the sidewalk is or should be) during any snow event. It is unlawful for any person to push snow or ice from private property into the traveled portion of the street or alley as to impede the passage of vehicles or create a hazardous condition.



#### WAGE EARNERS

Bring copies of check stubs for 30 day period preceding date of application-or copy of most recent federal income tax return.

#### FIXED INCOME

Includes-Social Security benefits,

supplemental security income, veterans assistance, unemployment & pensions. Bring check stubs from previous 30 days.

#### SELF EMPLOYED/FARMERS

Bring copy of most recent federal income tax return.  
\*if you receive alimony or child support, it will need to be verified. Additional income not listed here may be required

**WAYS TO CHECK FOR LEAKS**

- Check all faucets on the property. Replace worn washers of defective fixtures.
- Check toilet flush tanks by placing food coloring in the tank. Wait 15 minutes. Then check to see if the color leaks through into the bowl area. If the color comes through the toilet needs adjusting or repaired. A leaking toilet can waste 720 gallons per day.
- Check outside water taps to see that they are turned off when not in use.
- Turn off all faucets hooked up to washing machines or other water using equipment (when not in use) both to preserve equipment and to avoid leaks.
